- Conducted **13,208** hours of one-on-one instruction

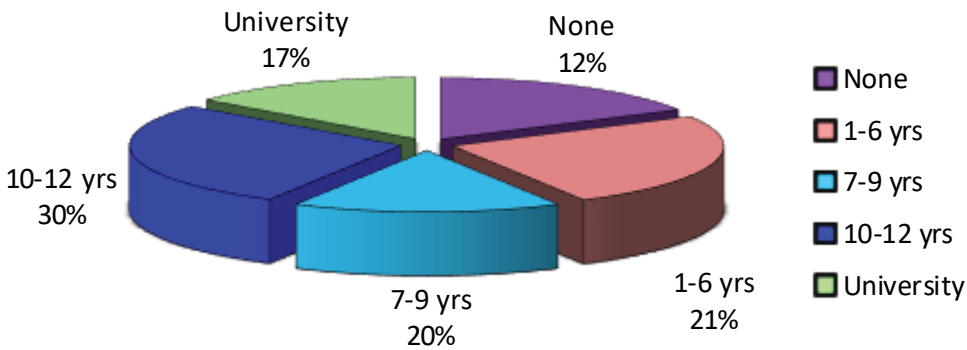


Our Students

Level of Education in Country of Origin

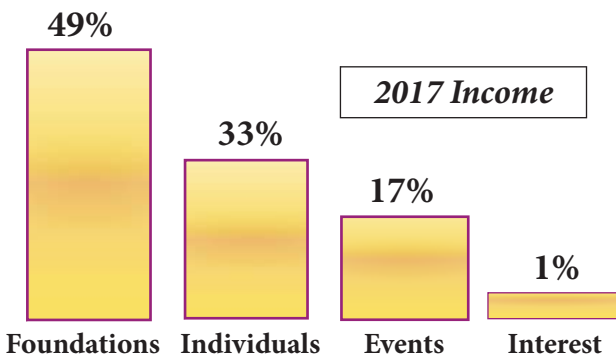

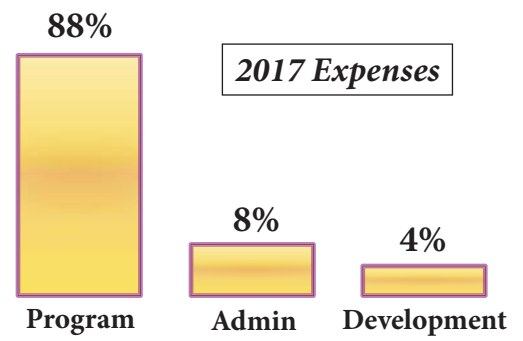

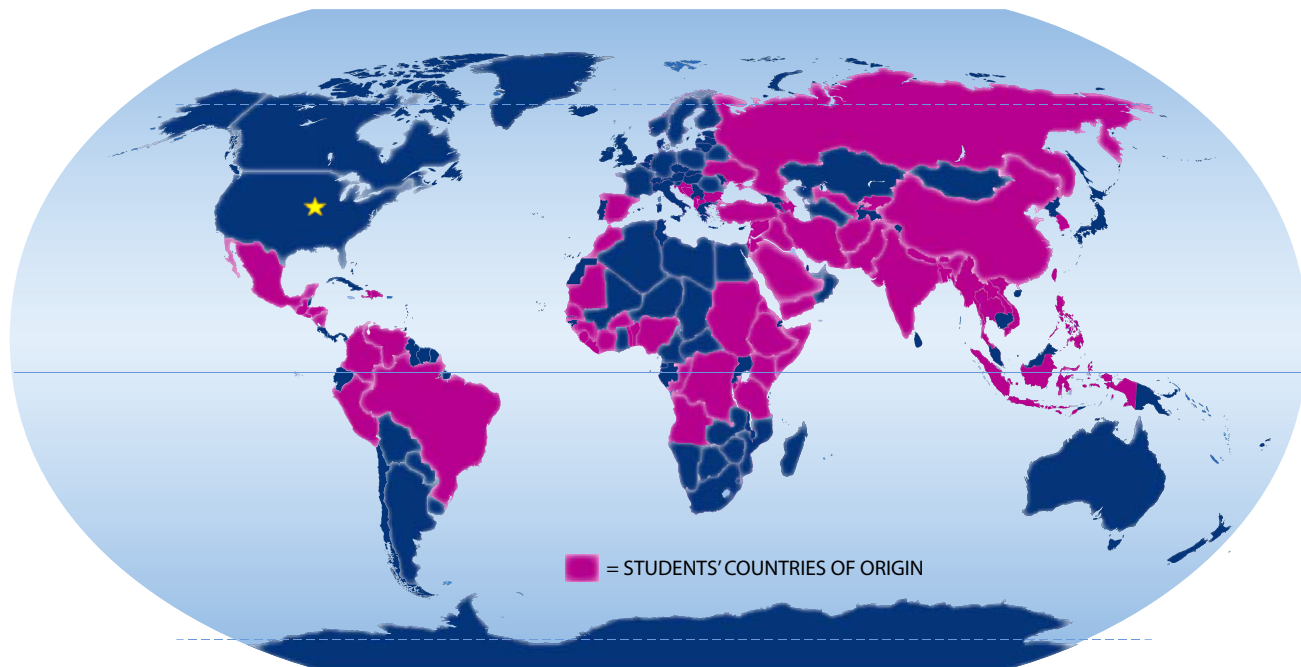
